Deans of Faculties.

- 132. (1) There shall be a Dean in each Faculty.
- (2) (a) The Dean of each Faculty shall be elected by the heads of each department of studies in that Faculty,
- (b) The Dean of a Faculty shall hold office for one year, but shall be eligible for re-election.
- (c) The Dean of the Faculty of Arts, Science or Medicine shall not hold office for more than two years consecutively.
- (d) The duties of Dean shall be prescribed by regulations made by the University.

Defence Services Academy.

- ²33. (1) There shall be established a Defence Services Academy at such place as the President of the Union may think fit and such Academy shall be deemed to be an affiliated College.
- (2) The management, administration and control of the Academy established under this section shall be vested in such authority as may be appointed by the President of the Union and the management, administration and control thereof shall be subject to such rules as may be made by the President of the Union under this section.
- (3) On admission to the Defence Services Academy a cadet shall be enrolled under the Burma Army Act.
- (4) The provisions of section 6, 9 (2), 11 (1) (d), 12, 12A, 15 (3) (i), 19 and 25 of this Act shall not apply to the Academy established under this section.

THE RANGOON ZOOLOGICAL GARDENS ACT.

[Burma Act I, 1908.] (25th April, 1908.)

Preamble.

WHEREAS at a meeting of subscribers held in Rangoon certain persons were appointed a Provisional Executive Committee for the administration of the [Rangoon Zoological Gardens]³;

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make provision for the vesting, maintenance and management of the [Rangoon Zoological Gardens]³ and for the appointment of a permanent body of Trustees;

It is hereby enacted as follows :-

1. This Act may be called the Rangoon Zoological Gardens Act.

Trustees.

- 2. (1) The Trustees of the [Rangoon Zoological Gardens]³ (hereinafter called "the Trustees") shall be the following. namely:—
 - (a) a representative of the Corporation of Rangoon;

- (b) a representative of the Commissioners for the Port of Rangoon;
- (c) a representative of the Burma Chamber of Commerce;
- 1 (d) the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Forests or his nominee :
- (e) a representative of the Burma Indian Chamber of Commerce;
- (f) a representative of the Burmese Chamber of Commerce;
- (g) a representative of the Chinese Chamber of Commerce:
- (h) the Chairman, Rangoon Development Trust [or his nominee]2;
- (i) the Chief Conservator of Forests, Burma [or his nominee]2;
- (j) the Chief Engineer, Public Works Department (Buildings and Roads Branch), Burma [or his nominee] 2;
- 1 (k) such and so many persons, not exceeding twelve, of whom four shall be representatives of public organizations, associations or unions, as shall from time to time be nominated by the Trustees with the approval of the President of the Union to represent the general body of subscribers.
- (2) The Trustees shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession by the name of the "Trustees of the Rangoon [Zoological Gardens] 3" and a common seal, and in that name shall sue and be sued and shall have power to acquire and hold property, to enter into contracts and to do all acts necessary for and consistent with the purposes of this Act.
- (3) All acts done by a majority of those present and voting at a meeting of the Trustees shall be deemed to be acts of the Trustees.
- (4) No act of the Trustees shall be deemed to be invalid merely by reason of any vacancy in or defect in the constitution of the body of the Trustees.
- (5) In the case of ex-officio Trustees the person for the time being performing the duties of any of the offices mentioned in sub-section (1) shall act as a Trustee.
 - (6) The Trustees may appoint a person to act as their Secretary.
- (7) Orders for the payment of money on behalf of the Trustees shall be deemed to be sufficiently authenticated if signed by two Trustees and countersigned by the Secretary.
- 3. All sums of money now in the custody of the said Provisional Executive Property Committee and all other property, whether movable or immovable, which have vested in Trustees. been or may hereafter be given, bequeathed or otherwise transferred for the purposes of the said [Zoological Gardens] 3 or acquired for the said purposes by the said Provisional Executive Committee or by the Trustees shall vest in the Trustees.

4. All officers and servants employed by the Trustees shall be deemed Officers and to be public servants within the meaning of the Penal Code;

servants to be deemed public servants.

Provided that this section shall not apply to persons in the service of any contractor employed by the Trustees.

Powers to make rules.

- 5. (1) The President of the Union may make rules 1 to carry out the purposes of this Act.
- (2) In particular, and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power, such rules may provide:—
 - (a) for the manner in which Trustees, other than ex-officio Trustees, shall be appointed and for the periods of time for which such Trustees shall hold office;
 - (b) for the manner in which the meetings of the Trustees shall be convened, the quorum necessary for the transaction of business and the procedure at such meetings;
 - (c) for the appointment of committees of the Trustees and the powers of expenditure and control which may be delegated to such committees;
 - (d) for the laying out, improvement, maintenance and management of the * *2 Zoological Gardens, the care and custody of the animals, birds, reptiles and other objects and things placed or deposited therein;
 - (e) for the form of accounts to be kept by the Trustees and for the audit and publication of such accounts;
 - (f) for the application to the officers and servants employed by the Trustees of the rules which apply to the civil servants of the Government or to any class of such civil servants;
 - (g) as to the conditions under which the public shall have access to the * *2 Zoological Gardens or particular parts thereof, and the regulation of the traffic of vehicles or animals and the conduct of persons entering the * *2 Gardens : and
 - (h) for the preservation and prevention of injury to or interference with any property vested in the Trustees, and for the prevention of persons from trespassing or permitting animals to trespass or pasture in such * *2 Gardens or particular parts thereof.
- (3) The President of the Union may by rule under this section attach to the breach of any rule made under clauses (g) and (h) of sub-section (2) a punishment not exceeding a fine which may extend to one hundred rupees.
- (4) All rules made under this section shall be made after previous publication and when made shall be finally published in the Gazette, and shall come into operation from the date of such final publication.

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS PRESERVATION ACT.

[INDIA ACT VII, 1904.] (18th March, 1904.)

1. *

- 2. In this Act, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or Pefinitions. context,-
 - (1) "ancient monument" means any structure, erection or monument, or any tumulus or place of internment, or any cave, rocksculpture, inscription or monolith, which is of historical, archæological or artistic interest, or any remains thereof, and includes-
 - (a) the site of an ancient monument;
 - (b) such portion of land adjoining the site of an ancient monument · as may be required for fencing or covering in or otherwise preserving such monument; and
 - (c) the means of access to and convenient inspection of an ancient monument:
 - (2) "antiquities" include any moveable objects which the President of the Union, by reason of their historical or archæological associations, may think it necessary to protect against injury, removal or dispersion;
 - (3) "Commissioner" includes any officer authorized by the President of the Union to perform the duties of a Commissioner under
 - (4) "maintain" and "maintenance" include the fencing, covering in. repairing, restoring and cleansing of a protected monument, and the doing of any act which may be necessary for the purpose of maintaining a protected monument or of securing convenient access thereto;
 - (5) "land" includes a revenue-free estate, a revenue-paying estate, and a permanent transferable tenure, whether such estate or tenure be subject to incumbrances or not; and
 - (6) "owner" includes a joint owner invested with powers of management on behalf of himself and other joint owners and any manager or trustee exercising powers of management over an ancient monument, and the successor in title of any such owner and the successor in office of any such manager or trustee:

Provided that nothing in this Act shall be deemed to extend the powers which may lawfully be exercised by such manager or trustee.

3. (1) The President of the Union may, by notification in the Gazette, Protected declare an ancient monument to be a protected monument within the meaning of this Act.

(2) A copy of every notification published under sub-section (1) shall be fixed up in a conspicuous place on or near the monument, together with an
